Dear Pastor and Church Family,

Greetings to you, my brothers and partners in prayer and ministry. It gives us joy to be able to communicate again through this letter and share with you our work for our Savior in the North of Argentina. We thank the Lord who allows us serve Him. We are not worthy, but his grace is greater than our weakness. I appreciate your prayers and offerings which help us to continue spreading the gospel of salvation to each community in the North of Argentina.

Brothers, with joy we tell you that we are busy in our church. Grace Baptist Church, in Tucuman, is growing. We no longer have enough space. The men of the church completely dismantled the premises and expanded it, despite the fact that we are experiencing inflation of 8% economically. For us, buying the materials is very difficult. God is showing us His power, and we are trusting in Him to reach the goals we have as a church. As the church grows, we rejoice at the addition of new families and people. Right now, in Tucuman, we are going through an epidemic of dengue, the disease that the mosquito produces when it bites, and we have many sick brethren. We are waiting for the cold days to rid us of the mosquitoes and kill this disease. I ask for your prayers for Emanuel and Juliana and their children Santino, Agostina and Emma, for Gustavo and Mariela and their daughter, Valeria, and a new young man named Caleb. These people received Christ as their personal Savior and are growing in discipleship and the Word.

In the month of January, we had our family camp and the children's camp. These two activities helped us to make contact with families and talk to them about the Word of God. We were able to sow the seed. Glory to God. The church was also involved in children's camps and activities. During the family camps, we had 8 professions of faith, and we are visiting and encouraging new believers to come to the church.



Brothers, we are encouraged by the work of the Rosario de la Frontera Faith Baptist Church. We continue with the construction and expansion with new rooms to have our first Sunday school. On April 23, we are starting Sunday school for the first time in the church, with classes for adults, youth, and children. The greatest blessing is that the teachers are brothers who were born with the church. They are fruits of discipleship and teaching.



During the month of February, the church organized a children's camp in a town called Metan. A total of 60 children attended, most of whom had never been in a children's camp before. The result of this camp is that 7 children are now attending the children's program that we have on Saturdays in the town. Brother Rolando Delgadillo leads this ministry with help from his wife and brothers of the church in Rosario de la Frontera. We continue working in Pueblo del Jardín, a community that is 2 hours away, in the state of Salta. We visited house to house, making contacts and, at the same time, saw some land for sale, with the plan to establish a Baptist church there.

We ask for your prayers, that the Lord will provide for us and open doors for us to continue with the visits in the town of El Jardín.

Regarding the aboriginal communities, in the month of June, I will be visiting the churches of the puna of Cusi. Cusi, as I mentioned in my previous letters, is a very difficult location due to the high cost of fuel. At this point, we are traveling there every three to four months. Please do not stop praying for the ministry to the aboriginal communities.

Brothers, we ask for your prayers so that God will provide for us to be able to continue advancing in the construction of the churches.

Brothers, as I told you, we are busy with construction, and we have some needs. Some of our tools are broken due to use, and we need to continue with the construction. Due to economic inflation, it is impossible for us to buy the tools. **We need: A cement mixer, which costs \$400, a bench saw for cutting wood (\$400), and a miter saw (\$250).**



Thank you, brothers, for your time in reading our letter. We pray for you, your churches, and especially for your country.
