Seeing the joy of these children was a blessing, and the biggest blessing of all was being able to share the gospel of salvation.

Our missionary, Silvia, worked together with Elizabeth, another missionary in Oromomo Trinidad. This is a community of the unreached. They are tribes from the Amazon jungle. The ladies made camps for the children and young people, sharing the gospel and strengthening the believers in this place with the Word. Now, our sister, Silvia, is returning to her ministry in the city of Trinidad. I ask for your prayers for male missionaries in the jungle. There is not a single one, only about 3 women serving in that place.
