Great Commission Fundamental Baptist Mission, Liberia:

The Great Commission Baptist Church baptized twenty new converts. Please pray for their commitment and Spiritual growth.

Deaf and Hearing Schools

Both schools have reopened. There are some new Deaf who enrolled this semester. Pray that they will accept Christ as their savior. Pray for God's provision as they build the Deaf school. The Hearing school did exceptionally well in most of the extracurricular activities, winning in music and quizzing. They also took second place in national debates. Fundamental Baptist Mission, Ivory Coast:

The Deaf camp marked the third quarter. The camp took place in the town of Agboville. One hundred forty people, made up of 130 Deaf and ten hearing supervisors, took part in the camp. In the end, 70 Deaf people accept Christ as their savior. They had two principal Deaf teachers from the United States, James Campbell and Pastor Michael Remington. They did the teaching. Twenty of the Deaf people who did not have a Bible were provided Bibles by Pastor James Campbell.

The Niangon Church

A new Pastor has been sent to Niangon Church to replace Pastor Gustave, who passed away unexpectedly two years ago.
