If God allows it, he will take the exam to enter the University again, for which I ask for your prayers. Haziel continues serving the Lord as a Sunday School teacher and with the instruments. My daughter, Haniela, by the grace of God, is in good health. She consecrates herself to the Lord, and is now supporting the children of Sunday School while she is in high school. Pray for her as she plays the violin, as we need a teacher to continue training her so that she can improve on this instrument. Please pray for my health as I suffer a lot from my throat.

Beloved Family in Christ,

May the Lord God continue to pour out great blessings in your lives. I am very happy to be able to greet you through this letter. Thank you very much for your great love and support in prayer and your generosity towards us, so that the work of our great God continues here in Raboso.

I share with you what God has allowed us to do as a family together with the brothers of the Church.

Evangelism: By the grace of God, we go out to visit on Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Fridays. On Saturday afternoons, we go out to knock on doors, and at night, we continue preaching in the hospital. In November, we began to preach in the town of San Isidro, where, thank God, Mrs. Hilda Lezama was converted. I ask you to pray for her. She wants to attend church, but the people of the town, seeing that we were visiting her, began to become aggressive and defensive, and many of them did not even open the door for us. We continued to knock on doors, trusting that God would do the work. There are people who listen with interest, but a family member comes and scolds them or prohibits them. A young man from this town, named Jorge Alexander, heard the gospel and received Christ, and by the grace of God he continues to receive us in his home to follow up.

In the Hospital: We continue preaching to the sick and their families and sharing food. At the same time that we are preaching in the open air and giving out food, some doctors and nurses arrive, since they also go out for food while they eat, and some listen to the gospel. We have seen that in recent months, groups from the Catholic and Adventist Church have been arriving as competition or as an obstacle, but God has supported us, since they do not preach the gospel of Salvation and they are not constant but sporadic. In addition, people, out of concern for their sickness, ask or expect that we pray for them and that the word be preached to them in each public sermon. By the grace of God, there are many people who make their profession of faith, and we hope in God that He does the work, that they do not forget when they leave the hospital.

Prayer Requests:

1. Wisdom and guidance from God in the ministry and for my health.
2. For boldness and the grace of God to preach the gospel.
3. For holiness and commitment in the Church.
4. For God to guard the hearts of my children and for them to love God with all their hearts and serve Him.
5. For God to allow my wife's health to remain stable and for her illness not to progress.
6. For God to provide me with a car or truck for the ministry - \$6,000
7. For God to provide a music teacher to train my children and brothers who want to learn to play an instrument.
8. For God to work in the hearts of the parents of the children who come to the Sunday School so that they do not stop coming and that they are reached by the Gospel.



In Missions: We continue working in the town of Pitayo every Tuesday, where we have discipleship and, in the evening, we have a preaching service. I ask you to pray for Brother. Telesforo Sánchez, since he was diagnosed with cancer in the neck, as he is the brother who donated the land for the mission. We continue to disciple 4 families in the municipality of Tlapanala. This year, with the help of God, we want to implement evangelism in the municipality and other surrounding towns, since these have a lot of people, and there are no churches with sound doctrine. There is only one Pentecostal and one Israelite in the entire municipality.

Activities: On December 7, God allowed us to attend a youth activity, where there were 4 young people who accepted

Christ: Manuel, Carlos, Daniela, and Camila. On the 22nd of the month, we had our Christmas service, thanking God since there were visitors who heard the message of Salvation. There were some mothers of the children who come to the Sunday Bible School, the mother of Sister Vero (for whom we have been praying since the church started), and the wife of Brother Noah (He has been converted for 10 months, but his wife had never wanted to hear the gospel.)

Materially: Pray that God will provide us with a van, as my minivan is already very old and worn down, as I use it to travel to visit, disciple, evangelize and go to the children. Even though I have taken it many times to the repair shop, it continues to cause problems. Pray that God will provide us with a reliable van. We are praying for \$6,000 for this need.
