Last year, in November, we successfully concluded our ministries in our churches, and this new year we prepare to start a new cycle.



We had a very good visit with our daughter, Salem, who was able to come from California after several years. God has been very good to us; she is now back in university. This year brings many challenges for our family. Our daughter, Gabriela, has started HomeSchool, a new stage for her. We pray that she adjusts well. So far, she is happy, and we feel calmer since the education system in Bolivia is quite poor, instilling ideas contrary to God in the minds of children.



### Sunday School for Children

Our children successfully completed the year with a good understanding of God's plan and design for the family. The teachers did an excellent job, and we are pleased with that. We hope to continue serving the Lord with continued enthusiasm of the children; teachers are preparing to start a new lesson cycle.



### Children's Ministry OANSA

In OANSA (AWANA), we also ended the year well, facing many challenges for the upcoming year. We hope to have many more new children and reach their parents with the gospel of Jesus.



### Youth Ministry

We finished the year with many challenges for the youth, focusing on evangelism talks. This year must be about putting it into practice and going to different locations to preach the gospel.

In January, we had a camping trip with the youth. It was a significant challenge for them, and they returned refreshed. We hope this new year brings even greater growth for the youth.



### Women's Ministry

This ministry has grown significantly through the Word of God. They completed a study on Bible study methods, so each woman is now better prepared to conduct her personal Bible study and apply it to her life. The sisters have worked hard to grow in Scripture, and they are also preparing for this new year.

### Marriage Ministry

We pray that God will always strengthen every marriage we have in the church. We live in times when divorce is now quite normal among Christians. Therefore, we want to help



strengthen these marriages with the Word of God, putting God first, and fostering an intimate communion with Him. This is key for each marriage to fulfill God's will. We have witnessed marriages going through very difficult times, and only the Lord can work in them.

### Anocaraire Church Ministry

The Anocaraire Church is eager to grow spiritually. Last year presented many challenges in serving the Lord, yet the brothers remain joyful as they continue to grow in their knowledge of Christ.



All ministries were carried out normally. OANSA continued working throughout the year so as not to discontinue the work being done with the children. Classrooms were built, and tables and chairs were set up for the children to provide educational support and to bring these kids the gospel of Christ.

### Missions

Our sister, Silvia, continues her work discipling women and children, also making missionary trips to the Eastern jungle, bringing the gospel, food, school materials, and clothing to these indigenous communities. To reach these communities, travel is done by canoe and often takes 4 to 6 days one way. God has been faithful in providing for these areas. Sister Elizabeth continues in Oromomo, discipling women and children and also supporting through education helps.



### Omereque Project

The Jaimes family remains in Omereque, learning more about the culture of the Quechua population. They are working with children in OANSA and have also opened an educational support initiative to teach these children, as the quality of education in school is very poor.
