Pastor Appiah preached at the service, while Pastor Damuoah did the committal. Pastor Appiah's message made a deep impression upon the large crowd.

On Sunday, I preached at the thanksgiving service and rejoiced to see many pray with me to receive Christ as Savior. In all, there was a good gospel witness during the funeral services, and we give praise to God.

On Easter Friday, we held a joint service for Ahodwo Nsawam and the Campus Church, hosted at Ahodwo Church. Different ones read the seven sayings of our Lord on the cross, intercepted with hymns. It was a blessing as we shared the power of God's forgiveness over our own lives, and the challenge that we also extend forgiveness to our fellow man.

We spent Easter Sunday with the Campus Church. In the service, we also had the blessing of a newly wed couple. We praise God that one person got saved in the Easter Sunday service at the Campus Church.

# Solid Rock Baptist Bible College

Dr. Victor Kugblenu has been the third Bible teacher from our College to travel to Sierra Leone to teach a two-week model. Our outreach program there is therefore working very well. Also, just before our Easter break, I completed teaching Advanced Theology to our bachelors group here at SRBBC at our main campus.

## **Church Planting**

This year, we are not intending to start a new church, but we want to work hard to help the last four churches that we have begun in the last few years to strengthen them. These are the Ahodwo Church, Nsawam Church (otherwise known as Ahodwoketewa Ch), Tamale Fellowship, and the new church at Gomoa Mopota South.

The Tamale Fellowship especially needs attention. For the second time, this fellowship has been kicked out of their classroom where they normally held their services. The Muslim leaders in the area are not happy that so many children are responding to our Sunday school and youth clubs. Consequently, they have instigated the leadership there, expelling our fellowship from the classroom. Unfortunately, the law is on their side, since the ban that was placed on churches during COVID-19 has still not officially been removed. We currently have very little we can do to remedy this situation. It is the second time, at two different locations, that we have been kicked out of the classroom. Therefore, we have to work hard to secure a place, maybe by building our own independent structure, before we can really have church services going. Brother Paul, the leader of the fellowship, tried to relocate Bible studies in his compound, but his neighbours in the apartment are opposed to any church activities taking place in that compound. So, this Easter, they went visiting house to house and giving out gospel tracts. Please pray with us that it will be possible for us to get a property in that area and erect our own tabernacle. While we are waiting to do so, if a private person will allow us to use their premises, that would be a blessing. Please pray that we'll be able to help the Tamale fellowship.

The Kumasi church has been able to put their roof on their building, but they did not complete the first floor. Currently, we need about \$7,000 out of the \$10,000 that we originally asked for. Pray that the Lord will supply this money for the Kumasi church to be able to fortify their new church building. The Ashaman Lebanon church (Comm. 22 Anex) has been able to raise the metal trusses on their building, and they are waiting now to be able to get timber and then roofing sheets to complete the roofing.

Pray for the church at Mpota. They are using an uncompleted house, and recently, the wind blew the roof off. They are seeking to get it fixed. Then, while they are using that, they will be looking for a property.

We want to thank you so much for your faithfulness in supporting us all these years. We are very grateful to have you as partners in the Lord's ministry.

May God richly bless and strengthen you and enlarge your borders.
