Dear brothers and sisters, pastor and church,

It is a pleasure to greet you and let you know what God is doing in this area of our country, where He allows us to work in His ministry.

In Evangelism: In January, we continued preaching the gospel door-to-door in the town of San Isidro, where 16-year-old Jorge Alexander accepted Christ. He was interested in receiving Bible studies, but his parents did not allow it, even though he sent them Bible-related messages via WhatsApp. We then continued in February and March with the people of Abelardo L. Rodríguez. There, Mrs. Teresa and her children, Evelin and Yesenia, accepted Christ, as did Mrs. Maribel and her daughters, Bonifaz and Kimberly. We are praying that they will decide to want to come to church and begin discipleship studies.

By the grace of God, a new family accepted Christ in Tlapanala on Friday, March 28th. (Mr. Rolando Samacona, his wife Inés Álvarez, and their daughter Evelyn Samacona Álvarez.) By the grace of God, they accepted the discipleship program. This encourages us because we have been praying for one more family in this town. May the Lord work in the hearts of the new brothers and sisters, and in ours, so that we can begin a new mission in this location. May God be at work. We also ask you to pray that the Lord will add more families and grant us land where we can hold services and invite people to hear the gospel. As of today, there are only five families. We ask for your prayers that the Lord will confirm this work in this town.

Hospital: God is good and allows us to continue preaching in the hospital every Saturday. There, we pray, preach outdoors, and witness to the sick in their beds.

Through sharing food and witnessing, we have been working in the hospital area for 15 years.

Missions: Thank God, two young men named Aldo and Diego have arrived and stayed at the Pitaya mission. They say they don't feel well every time we preach. Every Tuesday, when we arrive at the mission, we use the bullhorn for preaching, and since we are at the top of a small hill, the wind carries the sound. We began singing hymns and preaching the Word of God. They listened. Now, God, who has been working in their hearts, has caused them to return, and they have committed to the Lord not to stray anymore.

May God continue to raise up workers and give me wisdom and grace to prepare them for ministry.

For complete support so I can dedicate myself full-time to the work.

For the health of my wife, my children, and myself.

May the Lord continue to work in the town of Tlapanala and allow us to begin a project there.

May more children continue to come and for preparation for the Vacation Bible School.

May God open doors for us in the town of Xuchapa.

May God provide us with a car for the ministry. (\$6,000 needed)



We also continued visiting the town of Xuchapa, where, through God's help, we will be winning souls this Saturday.

Activities: In March, God allowed us to celebrate our anniversary service, where we rejoiced in the blessed Word of God that was preached. The visit of several brothers from different churches was a blessing, allowing us to sing together to our good God and hold communion. We had Pastor Adán Hernández from Olinala, Guerrero, and Pastor Hugo Mendoza from Puebla City as guest pastors.

We also ask that you pray for the children who come to church, as they usually come without a mother. We trust in God that the seed will be planted in the children's hearts and bear fruit in due time.

We also rejoiced on March 29th as brothers Noé Balbuena and his son, Carlos Balbuena, obeyed the Lord in the command of baptism. Their family, (his wife, his daughter, and his nephews), heard the Word of God but haven't yet made a decision, for whom I ask for your prayers.

By the grace of God, He allowed us to begin working with the youth, and we do so every Saturday at 10:00 am.

Beloved brothers and sisters, I thank you again for your prayers and support through your offerings that you generously share with us. May the Lord grant you rich and abundant blessings. I pray that you will pray so that the Lord's grace may always be with us.
