There is no fuel, there are lines for everything, and the worst part is that there are shortages of everything. Crime has increased considerably.



Children's Sunday School

The children are very precious. We only had a one-month break, and since February, we have begun teaching a series of topics so they may know the Lord better. We are trying to train teachers during these months so that each teacher can be better prepared to teach the children. This year, we are praying for men to become involved as teachers, since there are only women, and children also need masculine figures to teach them.



OANSA Children's Ministry

We began with leaders very motivated to continue preaching to children who don't know Christ. To this end, we are inviting school children to participate in this program. Children's work is becoming increasingly difficult because parents don't want to let them go or can't take them due to their busy schedules. They are often at home on their cell phones or watching television. It makes us very sad these days.



Youth Ministry

With the young people, we are learning study methods for interpreting the Scriptures, challenging them to interpret the Bible correctly, and encouraging them to share in the youth group. We will also have evangelistic outings with them to nearby towns, so they can share their faith with others.



Women's Ministry

The sisters are very motivated and committed to studying the Word of God, and each meeting is dedicated to learning more about the Scriptures. They are growing spiritually and preparing to serve the Lord.















Marriage Ministry

This year we want to address issues related to marital conflicts and how to resolve them in the light of the Word. We are encouraging our couples to become spiritually mature so that they can prevent marital problems. Each marriage will know how to have an intimate communion with God and His Word, because that is the only thing that will strengthen each marriage.

Anocaraire Church Ministry

We have a good team in Anocaraire who accompanies the pastor in carrying out the work of the ministry. Two young men are preparing to study the Scriptures. They are enthusiastic for the Lord, and it is our prayer that, in the future, they will be able to expand ministries to other communities.

We have resumed all of the ministries. We are grateful to have a good number of leaders who are serving with all their hearts. Three brothers were baptized in February, and this greatly encouraged the church, which continues to grow.

Missions

Our missionary, Silvia, is reaching out to other, more distant communities to preach the gospel and disciple these people. During this time, it's becoming difficult to reach them more frequently because there isn't much gasoline available in the country, and people have to wait in line to get it. God is providing in different ways, allowing us to continue bringing the gospel to these communities far from civilization.

Missionary Elizabeth is in Oromomo, in the Amazon rainforest of Bolivia, supporting the church through evangelization and discipleship for the children and women. She is very happy to serve the Lord there.

Omereque Project

The Jaimes family in Omereque is increasingly learning more about the culture of the Quechua people. They are supporting discipleship and working with the children at OANSA. This year, they decided to homeschool their children because they only have one teacher for the entire elementary school, and their children weren't learning anything.
