

Blessings, my dear brothers and sisters,

Thank you for your faithfulness in sending our missionary support each month. May God bless all the efforts you make.

We are very concerned as a family because the environment in Mexico has become more dangerous. Recently, we have been caring for some families with many problems. It is scary to even listen to their stories as they share their difficult experiences.

In the midst of insecurity, we continue to reach Mexican families with the gospel. Our work is not easy, as in addition to the possibility of danger, idolatry is prevalent here in Puebla, where we live. Please pray for us and for my children, Joel and Myrle, who are with us. It is very worrying when they leave home to fulfill their duties. We have been serving in Mexico for 27 years, and now we are praying that we can perhaps find another field in which we can work outside of Mexico.

## THE WORK

We are witnessing to a couple who lost their three-month-old baby two weeks ago. We are also sharing the Gospel with another couple with many serious problems, as the father of the family is a drug addict. We have a small congregation that, by the grace of God, has remained faithful, despite the changes we have experienced. Thank God, we've finished erecting a metal structure in a sister's yard. Just now, while it's been raining, we received help for this project. We also hope to build a cement floor, since we are literally meeting on a dirt floor. The cement floor will cost about \$800.

## FAMILY

My wife continues her treatment, trying to prevent her degenerative arthritis from progressing. To do this, we need to buy several medications monthly. She is walking as much as she can. Her arms still function at 30 to 40%. She has lost her cartilage, so she can't fully stretch her arms. She is 66 years old, and I am 74. I thank God for giving me good health to care for my wife and for the work here in Mexico.





## **CUBA, A MISSIONARY CHALLENGE**

Thank God, I have been able to travel to Cuba and offer supplies that many Cuban families need. I remember a sister crying when we gave her a tube of toothpaste. On my last two trips, we've brought more than 600 pieces of clothing. We've donated five bicycles to five Cuban missionaries, inverters for church buildings due to the constant blackouts in Cuba, some electric pots for the sisters who cook over wood, and many other things.



We gave a missionary a light for his house meetings. He needs a generator for his church building. He is praying for \$780 for this need.

I'm planning to visit my Cuban brothers and sisters in November. For this occasion, two field missionaries

have already asked me to help them with bicycles. Each bicycle costs me \$300 in Cuba. We also hope to bring a special offering to help a missionary at a church with a water pump, since they use buckets to get their water from a well. This costs approximately \$350.

I also agreed to bring offerings to buy bathroom fixtures, which they don't have. Three houses of worship need to buy a toilet bowl, a sink, faucets, and pedestal. This costs about \$280 in Cuba.

Please pray for and consider giving to meet the needs of our Cuban brothers and sisters, especially for the missionaries who are serving with many limitations.

I would very much like to bring a gift of \$100 each for 10 missionaries in November.

Thank God that one of my sons-in-law accompanied me to Cuba and has been instructed on how to channel the aid to our Cuban brothers and sisters. He is very trustworthy and loves the ministry I carry out in Cuba.

- 1. That God provides us with the medications and medical care my wife needs each month.
- 2. That God will care for our family, and that He will give us wisdom to make decisions amidst so much insecurity here in Mexico. Church families are already suggesting we leave Mexico.
- 3. For my son. Please pray that God will give him a good wife and a good job.
- 4. That God continues to add complete, consecrated families who are willing to serve in the church.
- 5. That God grants us good health and gives me great wisdom to continue teaching His blessed Word. I continue to teach the Book of Daniel on Mondays.
- 6. That God provides the finances for the projects in Cuba before our next trip in November, 2025.
