My family wishes you all many blessings, praying that you are always growing in your faith, as we also hope to grow in ours.

Here is our latest update for your consideration and prayer ministry with us.

Yesterday, someone wrote to me from the town of Concepción, where I was born. His name is Osvaldo, the son of my old friend, Daniel Aguirre. Daniel is not yet a believer, but he listens to us because we are very close friends (human friendship, but not spiritual ones). We gave Osvaldo a Bible (My family always wanted him to have complete Bible, because of the promise of God: "For as the rain cometh down, and the snow from heaven, and returneth not thither, but watereth the earth, and maketh it bring forth and bud, that it may give seed to the sower, and bread to the eater: So shall my word be that goeth forth out of my mouth: it shall not return unto me void, but it shall accomplish that which I please, and it shall prosper in the thing whereto I sent it. - Isaiah 55:10-11).

Osvaldo explained that he has already left the Catholic Church, but, unfortunately, he has found his way to a church that holds to a more Arminian view of salvation. They believe that salvation is by works, and you can lose it. In this town, there is no church of sound doctrine. That is why I call it a red zone. Sometimes I go on missionary trips as I have funds and time.



It happened that, about 4 months ago, I traveled to Concepción with my two children, and we preached the gospel for quite some time. We took advantage of the opportunity to preach to Osvaldo, striving by God's grace to be extremely clear with the gospel and praying that God would open his heart to the Lord. Yesterday, when we messaged on WhatsApp, Osvaldo told me he's waiting for us to study the Word of the Lord. This filled us with joy, as you can imagine. To leave the Catholic Church in Concepción carries a lot of social distress; even your family despises you. But, Osvaldo accepted Christ, and thirsts for the Bible, like I did in that town. Perhaps his father Daniel will be saved.

Osvaldo told me that his life has changed. This brings us joy like the Apostle Paul felt for the Philippians. Pray that we can go visit Osvaldo and the other friends we have there as well.

Speaking of conversion, Sister Gladis from our congregation in Mercedes told us that she has relatives who are very desirous to hear the Gospel. One of their relatives became ill and was hospitalized. She had a hard time going to visit him. Finally, accompanied by her husband Ernesto, she went and was able to tell him about Christ, and by the grace of God, he expressed his acceptance of Jesus Christ as Savior. His name is Ramón. Because of this, Gladis spoke to another relative, and that is yielding even more fruit. Please pray for Gladis' ministry among her unsaved family.

As I have told you in the past, we live here where Satan, who is currently the prince of this world, has his throne. Here in Mercedes, this is all too clear. They are a pagan society that worships a stupid gaucho (the cult of Gaucho Gil). Can you imagine what it means to us when just one person joins the church group and says, "I was blind, but now I see?" We are very happy. We were able to tour Uruguay and Brazil recently. By the grace of God, we are financially doing just fine. Inflation in Argentina was outrageous. Now, 1,000 Argentine pesos can't buy 1 kilo of bread; a year ago, it bought you approximately 2 kilos, and 100 dollars is now worthless compared to what it was worth a year ago. The new president who is running the country's economy is adamant that no more spending be done than the amount of foreign currency coming into the country. That's very good, but that adjustment left almost all of us poor, though the authorities are doing just fine. They say the previous government left debt for the grandchildren to pay, and many authorities became super-millionaires, and half or more of the country is hungry. Pray for Argentina.

May the Lord use this distress to bring souls to Himself.

#### PRAYER REQUESTS

1 - Our car's radiator broke. After checking it out myself, I went to a mechanic who told me not to travel. Nevertheless, I fill the radiator up with water from time to time so as not to melt the engine from overheating. The enemy doesn't want me to do my missionary tours.

2 - Pray for Osvaldo de Concepción and his father, Daniel, Osvaldo's uncle, Pedro, and all my friends there. I tell the believers here to take advantage of their human friendships to evangelize. I have some relatives who listen to me; we must pray for them. I have a very good neighbor to whom I preach at any time, and he hears me. A neighbor in Rivera accepted Christ, and we could spend a lot of time sharing the Gospel since he lives nearby.
