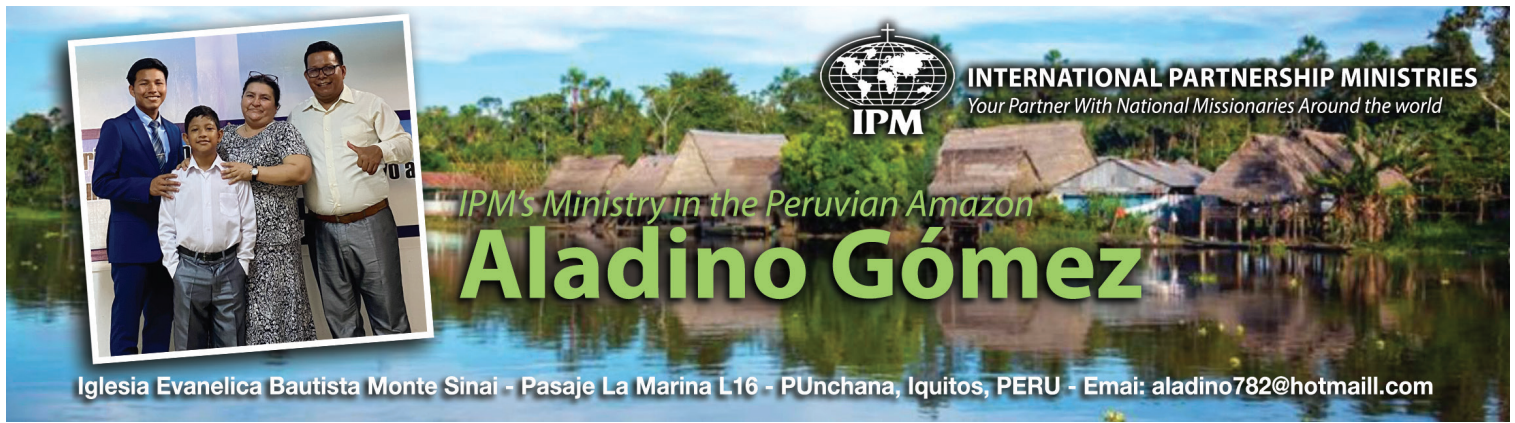




My dear brothers and sisters, September 2025

Please accept my greetings from the jungle of Peru, Iquitos. By the grace of God, we continue to work in the vineyard of our Lord Jesus Christ.

This year, God has blessed us with a new member of the family. Almendra Pierina is an 18-year-old young lady whom we met at one of the camps we held. Almendra was orphaned when her parents died when she was 10 years old. At 12, she accepted the Lord Jesus as her savior. She now lives with us and is a student at the Libertad Theological Seminary. She is also pursuing a technical degree in nursing and is a great supporter of children and youth ministry.

Kerwin Gregorio, my oldest son, is in his fourth year of theological studies in the city of Trujillo, and this year marks his graduation. My little one, Jabes Abdiel, is in fourth grade. Thank God, we are in good health.

By the grace of God, this year we took on the challenge of opening the Libertad Theological Seminary, of which the third module of studies has already been developed.

We held a youth camp for the first time in San Pedro de Huashalado, where I had the help of two of the seminarians, Kerwin and Jorge. These two young men will support me in the project of camps, seminary, and missions in this part of the Peruvian jungle. We also developed a church congregation for the first time in the facilities of the New Jerusalem Church of San Pedro de Huashalado. We thank God for this, and we are close to ordaining Brother Riquelmer Murrieta, one of the seminary students, to the pastorate. In addition, we have been able to update the seminary office with solar panels, a laptop, and a projector. We are still waiting to build the premises for the seminary and for a motorcycle van for transportation.

On September 4th, I traveled to the Bora community of Pucaurquillo to visit Pastor Adelmo and Wilder. After this visit, we will head to the Huitoto ethnic community of Tierra Firme. There, we will begin the construction of the Mount Horeb church, where the brothers will gather to study the Word of God and worship Him who lives and reigns forever and ever.

I am grateful to God for His goodness and the privilege He gives me to be part of His work on this earth.
