As always, we greet you in the love of the Lord, wishing you all well and many blessings. We have many concerns. On Sunday, October 26, we had baptisms; by the grace of God, it was a beautiful day. I am grateful to God for using me in the lives of so many brothers and sisters. To Him be the glory and to our Lord Jesus Christ. Here are some photos of the baptisms.

Sadly, the very next day, Monday, the 27th, a sister from the church, Isabel, passed away. When her husband arrived home from work, she suffered a heart attack as she tried to open the front door of their house, collapsing to the ground. In his desperation, the poor man put her unconscious in his car, and on the way to the hospital, she died in the vehicle. It was a terrible loss for him. She was 60 years old, and he is 67.

He called me to help while his wife's body was still in the car; it was heartbreaking to see her. His daughters, already married, arrived while their mother's body was still in the car. Imagine the sad moments we experienced. Thank God, as a church, we helped him pay for the funeral service, and we buried her on Wednesday, the 29th.

And now I'm in the midst of another terrible tragedy with the cyclone that hit Cuba. Matt Barfield and I had a trip planned for November 9th, but due to the devastation left by the cyclone, on the recommendation of the coordinating pastor in Cuba, we postponed our trip to Cuba until November 28th. Many churches are without roofs, some without doors or windows. In many of our brothers' homes, water entered, damaging their few belongings, and on top of all this, there is already a food shortage.











Here are some photos of the houses of worship. If you'd like to help our brothers and sisters in Cuba, please send your donation to IPM. My plan is to take offerings to buy zinc roofing sheets to cover the roofs of the houses of worship and to buy food for the affected families.

I'm also worried because our trip to Chile is fast approaching, on January 5th. The goal is to continue our missionary work both in Chile and Cuba.

Another burden related to the Chile trip is that upon arriving in Chile, a relative will be hosting us while we look for a house to rent. Unfortunately, we don't even have a single piece of furniture to furnish it. Please pray that our God will provide for us so we can buy the furniture we'll need: kitchen, dining room, beds, refrigerator, kitchen utensils, etc.

As you can see, these past months have been very heavy for us, but we trust in the Lord that He will act. Thank you, my dear brothers and sisters, for all your help. My wife is very grateful.
