Salem is in California with excellent grades, and Gabriela is finishing her homeschool classes and has adapted well to the pace of her studies.

I am also grateful for my wife. She is a wonderful woman whose support and help encourage me to move forward with even more enthusiasm and face new challenges in ministry.



We also greatly enjoyed our 25th anniversary as a church, which included a visit from the church in Anocraire. It was a truly blessed time.

Sunday School for children: They are now concluding their term, and each teacher is very enthusiastic about everything that has happened this year. It is clear that the children are growing in the Word of God. During this time, the teachers will be preparing for next year's program.



OANSA Children's Ministry

We are very happy to see what God is doing in this ministry. One of the sisters is bringing 10 children from her neighborhood, which is far from the church. These children come from Catholic families with limited resources. They are very happy, and we pray for their salvation.



Youth Ministry

Currently, the studies being conducted are on dating and finances. These young people are at a time when they must make good decisions for their future, and we want to help them do so biblically.



During this time, the sisters' attendance at their meetings has decreased. It may be that at the end of the year, their children are finishing school, and they are very busy, but they continue with their faithful study of God's Word.



Marriage Ministry

With the marriage ministry, we had a retreat where we were challenged by God's Word, and each couple made a commitment to God. The topic covered was, "Resolving conflicts God's way." This was a beautiful time of fellowship among married couples, sharing fellowship with one another.

This is a new challenge that God placed in our path, a new work in a rural area. We made an agreement with an association to work on their property with camps. We will also work with the pastoral family, evangelizing in this place where there isn't even a Christian church.

The property had been uninhabited for five years, and everything was in disrepair. Little by little, we are cleaning up the place and starting the ministry.
