The general camp started on the 15th and ended on the 20th. It included both hearing and deaf young people. The deaf came from the North, where their Deaf School is located. Many of them were unaware that we existed. One of them asked for the next Inclusive Camp Joy to take place in their city. I am planning this, God willing, in two years. A different village is already scheduled for next year.

## **KENYA**

### **Impacting Pastors and Churches**

The mission Bible Institute has been busy, continuing to encourage pastors and strengthening churches through impactful seminars and Bible classes. This past quarter, they participated in an excellent class focused on calling pastors to deeper spiritual growth, guided by 1 Peter 2:2 (longing for the pure spiritual milk; grow up!). Their main emphasis was the absolute necessity of the Word of God in the Christian life. They spent time lamenting how easily believers are tempted to prioritize self, human traditions, organizational policies, or denominational distinctives over the ultimate authority of God's divine Word of Truth. The mission was also thrilled to host their founding missionary, Pastor Deloach, and his wife, from Albemarle Baptist Church in Charlottesville, VA.

## **IVORY COAST**

From July 16 to 20, the MBF held two days of prayer at the Lakota church to encourage and exhort the faithful. They also had two days of a crusade. From August 16 to 23, the mission held a women's mission camp. The theme was "The Perfect Love of Christ in us. Two-hundred women attended. Thanks be to God. In this quarter, our missionary Konan Dennis baptized 19 people.

### **Ministry**

The MBF deaf ministry held a conference on Saturday, August 9, from 9 am to midday. The conference was held on the premises of the Port-Bouet II church. The conference began by thanking God for IPM for raising the sum of \$33,000 for the purchase of the second tranche of land for the Deaf. In all, about seventeen brothers and sisters who are interpreters or sign language beginners from the churches of Port-Bouet II, Anyama, and Abobo. The theme of the conference was "How to have a successful Deaf ministry," and David Bennett, a missionary from Silent Word Ministry International in the United States, led it. From August 11-14, a spiritual retreat was held in the Port-Bouet II church instead of the Deaf Bible Camp that we organize every holiday. This spiritual retreat was directed by the Silent Word Ministry International team and led by the retreat leader. The 45 Deaf participants came from the churches of Port-Bouet II, Anyama, Abobo, Agboville, Daloa, and Abengourou. During this spiritual retreat, five young Deaf people prayed to accept Jesus Christ as their Savior. We pray that their faith will grow for the glory of God.

## **LIBERIA**

The mission had a successful men's conference. It was held at our recently dedicated church in Ganta. This year's theme was "Preparing for Posterity." There were several teachers and preachers.

### **Youth Ministry**

The mission has had two youth outreaches in two separate locations since June. Approximately 815 attended, and 404 were saved, while several individuals rededicated their lives. MThank God for protecting three of our team members who were involved in a motor accident and were injured.
