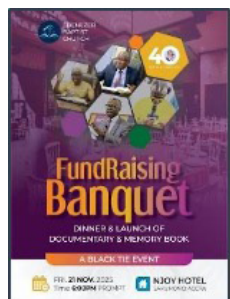

EBENEZER BAPTIST CHURCH

The last quarter of 2025 was very busy as we had many activities. The church was occupied with the preparations for my retirement as the Head Pastor of the church, and a series of activities were planned.

The church organised a week-long celebration from November 16 - 23. On November 16, our choir, together with choirs from three of our sister Baptist churches, came together for a concert made up of my 40 favourite hymns, dubbed "40@40," that is, one hymn for each year of service. It was truly a magical experience.

On November 18, a Bible symposium was held. A lecturer from one of our Bible institutions walked us through the history of the Bible and its various translations.



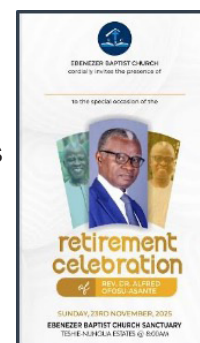
On November 21, a fundraising banquet was held, with a comprehensive documentary showing highlights of my ministry, as well as the various goodwill messages. A Memory Book, which had been compiled in the weeks leading up to the celebration, was also presented to me.



The climax of the celebration was held on Sunday, November 23. A Retirement and Thanksgiving Service was held, which was attended by friends and family members, as well as the regular congregation.



The Associate Pastor, Rev. Josiah Agyei Mante, was officially inducted as the head pastor on January 04, 2026. Please pray for him as he leads the church.



The church organized a residential camp for its children, dubbed "Amazing Camp", which was run from December 26-31, 2025. During this time, the children stayed in our school block, which was transformed into sleeping quarters, as the regular school had vacated for the Christmas holidays. 122 children and staff attended, and they had a wonderful time studying God's Word.



GOD IS ABLE PASTORAL MINISTRY (GIAPM)

Having retired from the church, I am following the new direction of ministry in which the Lord has led us. My full attention will be focused on God Is Able Pastoral Ministry (GIAPM), the ministry the Lord directed me to start five years ago. The ministry aims at “pastoring pastors” through counselling, workshops, seminars, and ensuring the welfare and total wellbeing of our pastors, to be fully equipped to do an effective and exciting work for the Lord. So far, the ministry has succeeded in bringing over sixty (60) pastors under a pastoral care program which involves life insurance, burial, care for widows, and the possibility of retirement funds. In the past couple of weeks we have received applications from two more pastors who want to join the program. I covet your prayers as I trust the Lord to help me bring all our pastors together to work as co-labourers in the Lord’s vineyard. *EDITORS NOTE: The retirement and insurance service that Americans are accustomed to are not available in many developing countries. Because Alfred has made this program available, godly men and their families have been greatly helped. *

We are also planning, with the Lord’s help, on starting a children’s ministry in the area we live, within the first quarter of this year. Plans are far advanced for its inauguration. We will call it KIDS FOR CHRIST (KFC). Again, we ask you to pray for us as we follow the Lord’s leading. Anna and I, as well as our children, are very excited about the new ministry the Lord is leading us into.
