Beloved Pastor and Church,

We are pleased to greet you in the love of Christ and share with you what the Lord allows us to do here in our area, of which you are a part.

Missions: By the grace of God, we continue to win souls in the municipality of Tlapanala, 35 minutes from Raboso, where in these past months, 7 people were saved and many more, although they heard the message, did not make a decision for Christ. I was also moved that two children, one 7 and the other 9 years old, listened to the gospel for almost an hour while my son Haziél preached to them. In the end, they accepted Christ and with great enthusiasm said they wanted to go to church. So far they haven't come, but we continue to pray that their parents will give them permission and that they too may be saved.

We also continue to have services and discipleship with the Samacona family. Last week, I visited Brother Magdaleno. This brother's son died two years ago from pneumonia. Before he was intubated, he sent for the priest, but the priest did not come. He asked for the prayer leader, but he didn't go either. A brother who was in the hospital told him that if he wanted, he would call his pastor (me). He said yes, and so I went. His son was already in intensive care. His son was conscious, and I preached to Magdaleno and his son, who was crying. They both accepted Christ. His son died 3 days later. Magdaleno's family is very Catholic. In fact, they participated in the Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe. Magdaleno remained firm in his faith and did not participate. I beg you to pray for him so that he may grow in faith, that he may soon attend church, and that his family may also be saved.



In El Pitayo, we continue to have services every Tuesday, and discipleship continues with



Brother Ausencio and Sisters Marlen and Blanca. In November, Brother Anastasio, a 91-year-old man, and Miss Alejandra made professions of faith, and we have begun discipling them.

Hospital: Every Saturday, we continue to preach the gospel, and many people make professions of faith. Most of them are from surrounding towns. Please pray that God will work in their hearts and bring conviction of sin so that they may sincerely turn to Him. Some also ask us for addresses of churches near their towns, and if there are any, we connect them with those churches.



In the Church: We continue with the music class, as there is a new group that wants to learn. The goal is to have an orchestra in the church. We are preparing five new brothers who have decided to obey God through baptism. We also had our Christmas service, and by God's grace, there were guests who were able to hear the message of salvation.
