We bring you greetings from Ghana. It's a delight to be able to share with you what the Lord has been doing through us here in West Africa and elsewhere. And thank you so much for your prayers and support for our family and ministry.

Trip to Ivory Coast

From February 10-16, I was in the Ivory Coast at the invitation of the Fundamental Baptist Mission under Pastor Nado to speak at a five-day missions conference. It was a wonderful time of sharing, and it was a blessing. The FBM has also requested that we help them to train some of their pastors as we are doing for some pastors in Sierra Leone. There is a language barrier here, and so we are praying about the possibility. If all goes well, we might be able to do this to help our sister mission there, Lord willing, next year.

Trip to India and a Doctor of Divinity Degree

From February 28 to March 14, Vera and I were in India at the invitation of Dr. P. D. Cherian, President of South India Baptist Bible College and Seminary in Coimbatore. During our visit, I had the opportunity to preach several times at the chapel and also at their 40th Annual Graduation Conference.

I was also awarded an honorary Doctor of Divinity degree at the 40th commencement of the South India Baptist Bible College & Seminary. I want to thank God for this honor and encouragement. The visit was a wonderful experience. It was a rich blessing to see what God has done and is still doing in India, notwithstanding all the restrictions that they face.

Now back to Ghana

We celebrated Easter with four of our Churches.

First, there was a joint Easter Friday service held at the Campus Church for our churches at Ahodwo, Nsawam, and Ankwa Dobro, where I had the opportunity to also be the keynote speaker.

On Easter Sunday, I was at Solid Rock Baptist Church of Tema Community Two, and I brought the Easter message. On Easter Monday, we held a picnic at the campus church for the three churches in the district and enjoyed a wonderful time of fellowship.

Bodomase Church Gets Pastor

An induction service was held for Brother James Sarpong Dam at SRBC on campus. He has completed his studies at SRBBC. Pastor James and his family have since moved to Bodomase, and have assumed leadership for the SRBC in that township.

Trip to the Ashanti Region

We travelled to the Ashanti Region to join our church at Drobonso and Bodomase in a joint service which welcomed Pastor James Sarpong to the Ashanti Region and into the ministry of the Bodomase Church. It was a blessing speaking at the ceremony.

On January 28, I led a delegation to Sefwi Bekwai to mourn with the family of the late Professor Amako Gyampah. He was the first person to be baptized at Solid Rock Baptist Church, Community Two, Tema, on the very first Sunday morning that that fellowship was started on August 16, 1981.
