Greetings from the Peruvian Jungle (Iquitos). May Almighty God continue to bless you abundantly for His glory.

I am deeply grateful to God for all of you who pray for the ministry in the Peruvian jungle. My family's health is currently fair; my wife, Fe Tuanama, was recently diagnosed with pre-diabetes. However, not everything is bad news; we are also joyful because my son, Kerwin Gregorio, has completed his four years of theological studies. We are now working together in the ministry—both within the local church and in missions—as well as teaching at the Libertad Theological Seminary.

As a church, we continue to preach the Holy Gospel of Jesus Christ and establish new ministries along the Amazon River. On this occasion, we reached the community of Sancudo (First Zone), where 22 people accepted Jesus as their one and only Savior; we are now praying for the resources to build a house of prayer there.

During the final days of January, we hosted the first fellowship gathering for the Baptist churches of the Lower Amazon region in the native community of Tierra Firme, where 11 churches came together.

Through our youth ministry, we held the Apayacu 2026 Youth Camp, where we hosted unsaved young people. By the grace of God, every single one of the unsaved attendees accepted Jesus as their one and only Savior. Additionally, seven students from the Libertad Theological Seminary played an active role in this ministry, serving as counselors and speakers.

Regarding our seminary ministry, we began our first module of theological instruction in early March, with a class of 27 students, 4 teachers, and 2 support staff members. We are in need of financial support for this ministry, as we have many pressing needs—such as classrooms, dormitories, a dining hall, and more. I ask for your prayers for provision for this ministry.
