We are always grateful to our God for the service the mission carries out; thank you for your dedication. You are in our prayers and in our hearts.

These past few months have been a great blessing for both our family and the churches. Despite trials, we see God's hand in the midst of them; these challenges help us grow and cling more closely to the Lord. My wife is in excellent health and continues to serve in the children's ministry, which is her passion, as well as the women's ministry. My son Esteban continues his work at the children's school; we pray that this becomes his mission field and that he can reach many children and their parents with the Gospel. Salem has finished another year of university; she stayed to work during her break to pay for her studies. Our prayer is that God transforms her heart as she studies His Word and uses her in His service. Gabriela has adapted well to her new school and is making new friends; may she be an influence who reflects Christ at her school.

At the Cochabamba church, we are praying for a new location, as our current space is too small and the rent is very high. Thank God we are forming a ministry team; we pray that God calls some of them to pastoral ministry. There are six brothers currently preparing in the Word, and two more sisters who will leave this month for training. God is very good.

Children's Sunday School

Due to the change in location, some children are no longer attending, but this motivates the teachers to go out into the neighborhood to seek them out and win them for Christ. The teachers are well-equipped to faithfully teach God's Word.

AWANA Ministry

This year, the program is operating only in Anocaraire with about 45 children, and the leaders are very enthusiastic.

Youth Ministry

In Cochabamba, Brother Luis Gruich and his wife lead this ministry every Saturday, covering profound topics that challenge the young people to serve the Lord.

Women's Ministry

The sisters meet every Tuesday to study the Gospel of Luke; they are growing in the Lord and go out to evangelize one Saturday a month, an activity that greatly encourages each of them.

Anocaraire Church Ministry

These believers are growing, not only in knowledge but also in practical living, and are serving as a testimony to the community. As a church, they identify the financial needs of those in want and meet them; this opens hearts to hearing about Christ. Each ministry is well-organized, and they are even providing financial support to two young people who are finishing their seminary studies.

Couples' Meeting

At every meeting, we are challenged by the Word to be good stewards of the resources God grants us. We also faced some trials involving couples who turned away from the Lord, which caused us great sorrow.

Missions

Our missionary now faces a major challenge: bringing food, clothing, and the Word to an unreached





community, a journey that takes nearly five days by boat. We are praying for God's provision and for the sister's health.

Omereque Project

In June, we held a retreat in Omereque; it was a great blessing and an encouragement to continue the Lord's work, as well as a challenge for families to remain Christ-centered.



Tolata Project

The children's ministry in this area is beautiful, especially since there are no other churches in the region. Many of these children and adolescents have accepted Christ and are growing in the Lord's grace. A family from Cochabamba comes to help us with this ministry, and we give glory to God for His faithfulness.
