Bible Institute

Since March, the fifth class of students has begun its academic year, and the courses are continuing successfully. The director is proud of the Bible Institute because it is helping to secure the future of the next generation.

Please also pray for the purchase of land for the Bible Institute. My vision is to build both the church and the Bible Institute on the same property. Please pray that God will hear and answer our prayers.

Visit to some of the mission churches

During the past several months, Rev. Zamee Denis Konan, the Director of the mission, had the opportunity to visit most of their churches. He was blessed to be a part of a missionary conference they organized. Rev. Zamee Denis Konan was also able to visit fellow missionary, Médard. The over-600 km (400-mile) journey had to be made by bus because the director does not have a car. In this region, there are 3 fellow servants, but because of the rain and the road conditions, they were only able to visit one. The mission held a two-day evangelistic campaign during which two people were saved. Rev. John Luke's church is still holding its worship services in a school building, which is not legally permitted. Please pray that funds will be provided to purchase church property so we can acquire land for the church. Please also pray that we will not be forced to leave the school while we seek a permanent place of worship.

Ethiopia

The outreach to the nearby village town of Chacha continued. One of the leaders does visit there three times a week, and we are seeing good reports: people are taking evangelistic literature, and three people are coming to Church every Sunday. It is 20 kilometers away from Debrebirhan. Many have expressed interest in attending church, and we plan to plant a church there.

The mission thanks God for the two new people who are following discipleship lessons, and for the eight more who have shown interest in enrolling soon. The Saturday teenagers' teaching and gathering have helped them grow in grace and understanding of the truth. Please pray for many young people to come, receive spiritual help, and grow in grace among us. All the outreach places and church-planting endeavors are going very well. Please pray for God's help to reach many and plant many churches in the area.

Church Growth

The leader praises God for His work in our church. Several people are preparing for baptism and membership, and two brothers are being added as deacons. Our church plants continue to grow, and our pastors remain steadfast despite the normal challenges of life and ministry.

Umoja-Mbuyu Mission

The Umoja-Mbuyu preaching point has grown remarkably over the past year. By God's grace, they have secured land and begun raising funds locally for a permanent home. They have already acquired some construction materials, and their goal is to raise \$18,380 to complete the auditorium and a washroom block. They humbly invite you to prayerfully consider supporting this work as the Lord enables you.

Community Background

Umoja-Mbuyu lies about 25 km from Nyahururu town, in a community of subsistence farmers and small business owners. Most residents were displaced during the 2008 post-election violence, with over 400 families resettled here. Many lost everything in the tribal clashes, yet today we thank God that they are rebuilding their lives. Worship gatherings have become a source of hope and healing, and we now have two churches among the internally displaced persons, with Umoja-Mbuyu being the newest.
