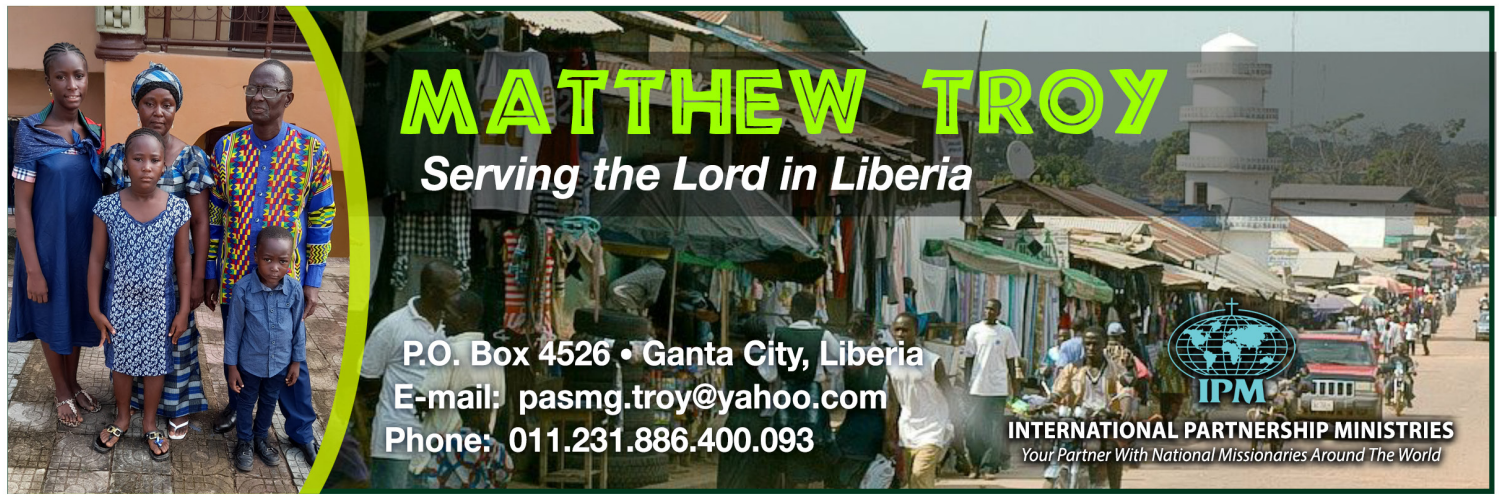




Dear Prayer Partners and Supporters,

Calvary greetings to you all in the precious name of Jesus Christ, the Savior of the world.

Thank you for your fervent prayers and faithful support for the Lord's work around the world. We are able to continue actively serving the Lord in Liberia because of your partnership with us. As Romans 10:14–15 says, "How shall they hear without a preacher? And how shall they preach, except they be sent?" We are grateful that you have sent us through your prayers, encouragement, and support. Here are some updates, praises, and prayer requests from our ministry.

Family

We praise the Lord for His goodness and faithfulness toward our family as we serve Him in Liberia, West Africa. In spite of the many challenges we encounter daily, especially the ongoing problems with mosquitoes and malaria, we continue to see the faithful hand of God at work. My wife, Jehoaddan, has not been feeling well. She has been experiencing problems with her nerves and high blood pressure. However, despite these challenges, she continues faithfully serving the Lord. Please keep her in your prayers. Our third son, Matdan Tom Troy, will be graduating from college this year with a degree in the sciences. He is hoping to enroll in medical college if the Lord opens the door for him to pursue a career in medicine. Liberia does not currently have a dependable medical college that can provide the training he needs. Therefore, Matdan Tom Troy may have to travel outside Liberia to complete his medical education. Please pray for the Lord's provision and guidance as he pursues this dream.

Transportation Need

For the past several months, we have been facing serious transportation challenges; our old vehicle frequently needs repairs whenever I travel for ministry. Because of the unreliable condition of the vehicle, there are many evangelistic trips that I cannot make. Motorcycle transportation is also becoming increasingly risky in some areas because of the difficult economic conditions. Many people depend on motorcycles for their livelihoods, and motorcycle-related robberies and violent crimes have become a serious concern. We are therefore praying for the Lord to provide a double-cab pickup truck that can be used for our various ministry needs, including evangelism, church visitation, outreach, and transportation of ministry materials. Please pray with us for God's provision of this much-needed vehicle.

The Church

We are very grateful to God for His sustaining power and faithfulness. Our churches continue to grow, but maintaining the membership and reaching people consistently also presents challenges. Many people move from one church to another from week to week. The influence of the charismatic movement is widespread, and some people are attracted to churches primarily because of drumming, dancing, and emotional excitement. Nevertheless, we continue to faithfully preach God's Word and carry out extensive visitation. We are visiting homes throughout the new community where we have established our central church, and new worshippers continue to join us. We are also planning a revival meeting in late October of this year to strengthen and encourage the church. Please pray that this meeting will have a lasting spiritual impact on our members and community. During the past several weeks, six people have accepted Christ as their personal Savior, and five others have followed the Lord in baptism in the St. John River. We praise God for these decisions and pray that these new believers will grow in the grace and knowledge of Jesus Christ.

Outreach Ministry

We thank the Lord for the outreach programs of our churches. Recently, our team visited Karplay Town,



where seventeen people were led to Christ, and four of them subsequently attended our church services. Karplay is a commercial hub near the Ivorian border, approximately 67 kilometers from Ganta, where we are based. Through the grace of God, we have planted Charity Baptist Church in the area. The church currently has an average attendance of approximately 25 people and is trusting the Lord for its own permanent place of worship as the congregation continues to grow. Please pray for the spiritual growth of this young church and for God's provision of a worship center.

Teen Camp

The Great Commission Fundamental Baptist Church hosted a youth camp this year. With the help of CampsAbroad, we successfully conducted the camp with 50 campers and 10 facilitators. During the camp sessions, 12 teenagers accepted Christ as their personal Savior, and 15 others rededicated their lives to the Lord. We praise God for what He did in the lives of these young people.

We are praying for continued sponsorship of this camp ministry. The cost is approximately \$30 per camper, which many parents and campers are unable to afford. In order to continue this important spiritual ministry, we are trusting the Lord for the necessary provision. Our desire is to conduct the camp twice each year. Please pray with us that God will provide the resources needed to continue reaching young people for Christ.

Deaf Ministry

The deaf community continues to grow in Liberia, particularly in rural areas where many have little or no opportunity to hear the Gospel in a language they can understand. Of Liberia's 15 counties, only a few have facilities serving the deaf community, including Montserrado, Bong, Grand Bassa, and Nimba Counties. Some of these facilities are government institutions. Because of limited opportunities, resources, and trained personnel, many deaf people are growing up without access to the Gospel and without hearing the saving message of Jesus Christ. Recently, we received what we believe was a Macedonian call to another county. Our team traveled there, and during the visit, two deaf people accepted Christ, while twelve hearing young people also acknowledged Jesus Christ as their Lord and personal Savior. The people we met pleaded with us to return and begin a church and school ministry in the area. Please pray for wisdom, workers, resources, and God's direction as we consider this new ministry opportunity.

Christian Foundation School

The Christian Foundation High School recently completed its academic activities for the 2025–2026 school year. The school has classes from Grade 1 through Grade 11, with an enrollment of 286 students. The institution is currently awaiting the government examination results for the graduating Grade 12 class. Please pray for the upcoming school year. Because of the difficult economic situation, we anticipate lower enrollment, which may make it difficult for us to adequately support and compensate our staff. We greatly appreciate your prayers as we continue serving the Lord through Christian education in the rural parts of Liberia. As economic conditions become increasingly difficult, we continue to trust the Lord for His provision and faithfulness. We are praying for your spiritual, physical, and financial well-being as you faithfully partner with us in the work of the Gospel.
